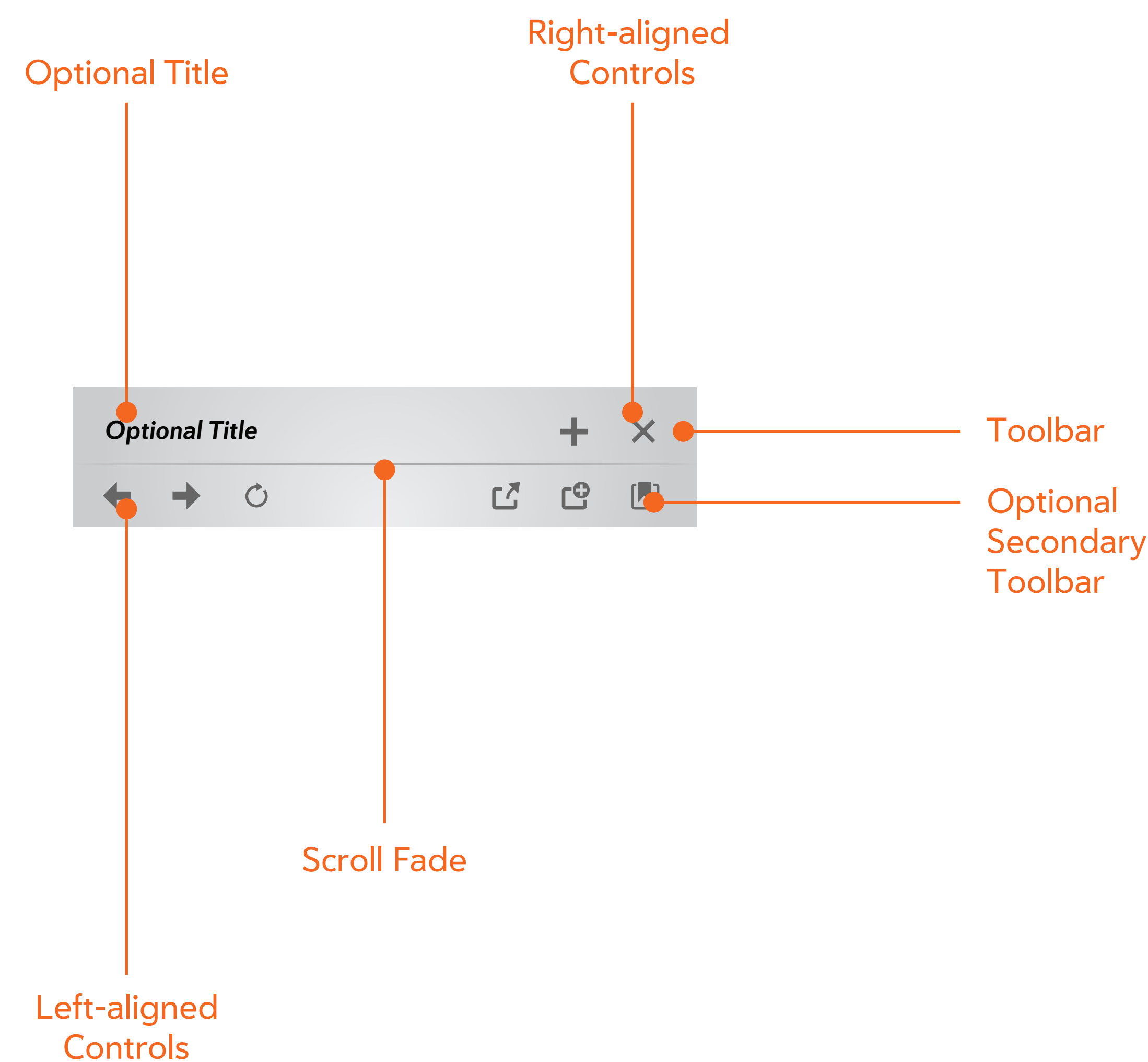
SUMMARY

A Toolbar is visible chrome that can contain information or controls. They can have hide/show capabilities.

GOALS

- To provide visible chrome (Mochi Headers and Footers do not have any visible chrome) for apps that require it.

STRUCTURE



Toolbar

Visible toolbar that contains scene-relevant controls. Typically persistent.

Secondary Toolbar

Optional sub-chrome that can contain more controls. Typically can be hidden or shown via gesture.

Scroll Fade

Used to separate toolbar from secondary toolbar. Not necessary if there is no secondary toolbar.

Optional Controls or Information

Toolbars can contain controls, titles, information, etc. These can be right, left, or center-aligned. Examples of content in a toolbar can include:

- Badging
- Buttons
- Date and time
- Etc.

Height & Width

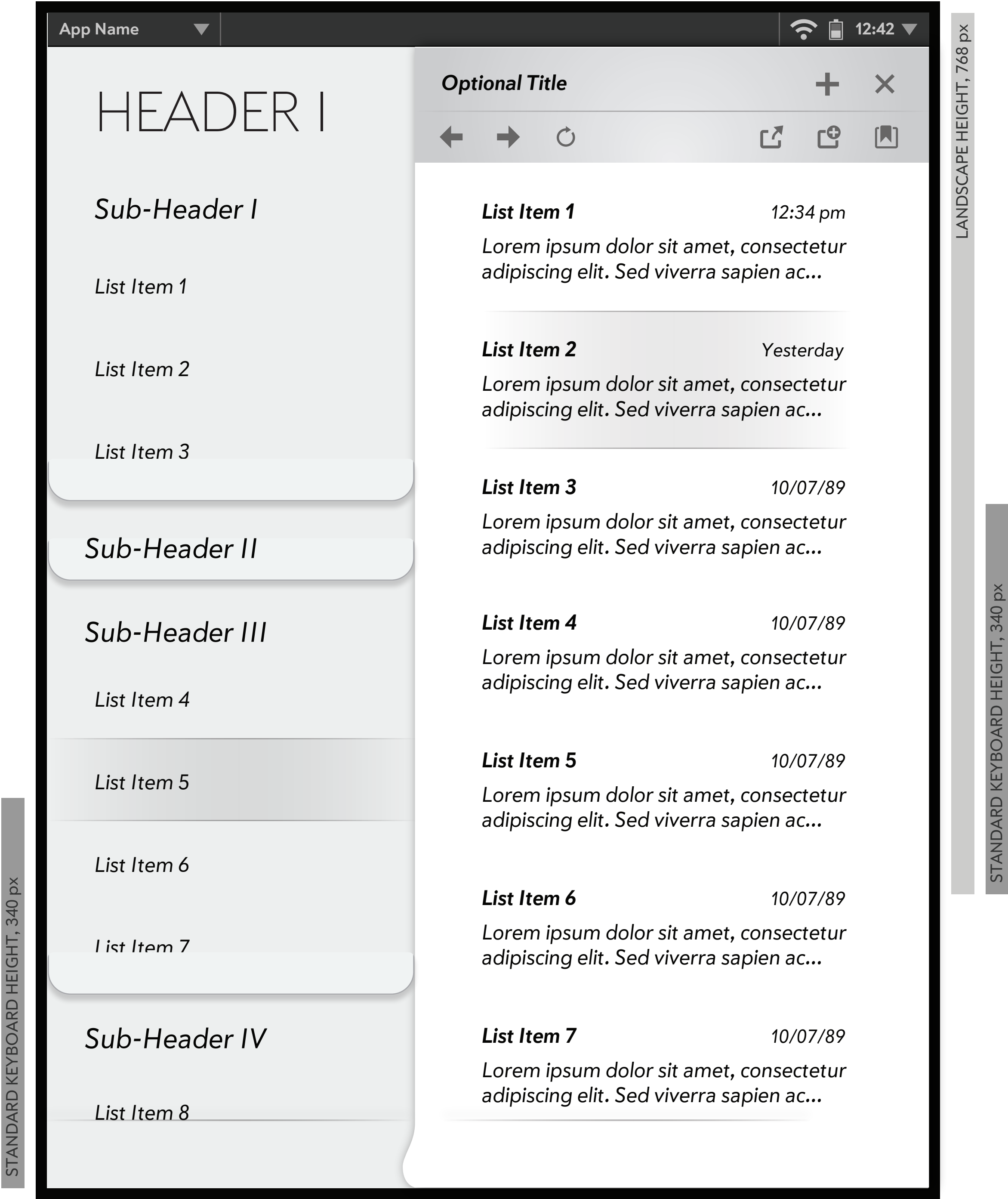
Toolbars have fixed height but can vary in width. Please refer to the Toolbar Redlines documentation for more details on the visual design.

Platform Variations

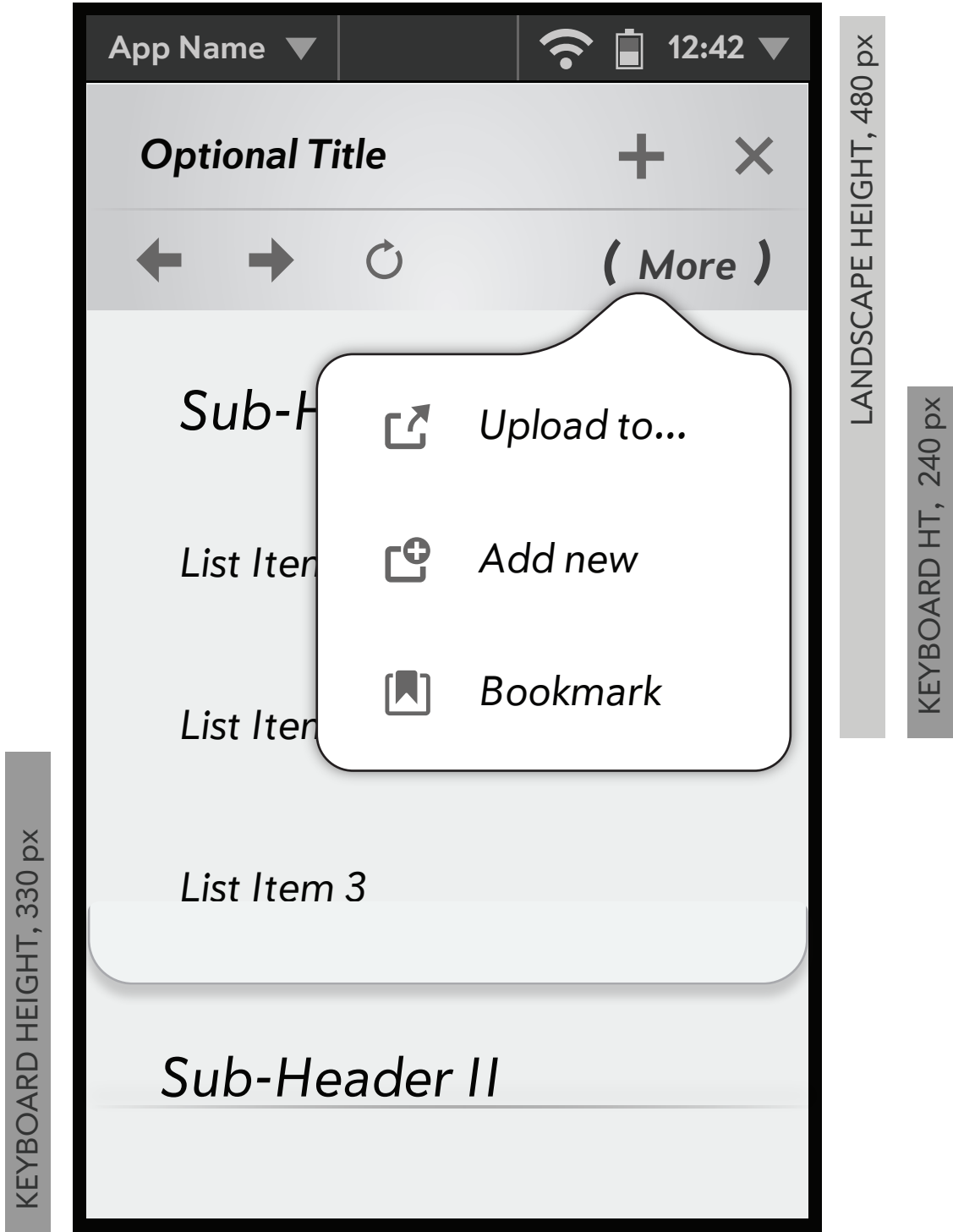
Text within truncates when it reaches min padding within the Toolbar. Controls that do not fit on the Toolbar (for example on a phone) will be automatically put into a (More) button.

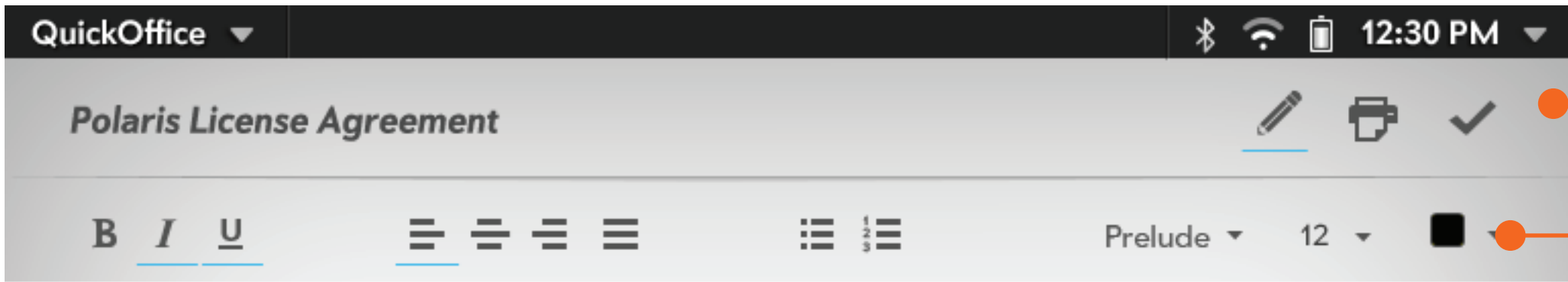

Secondary Toolbar

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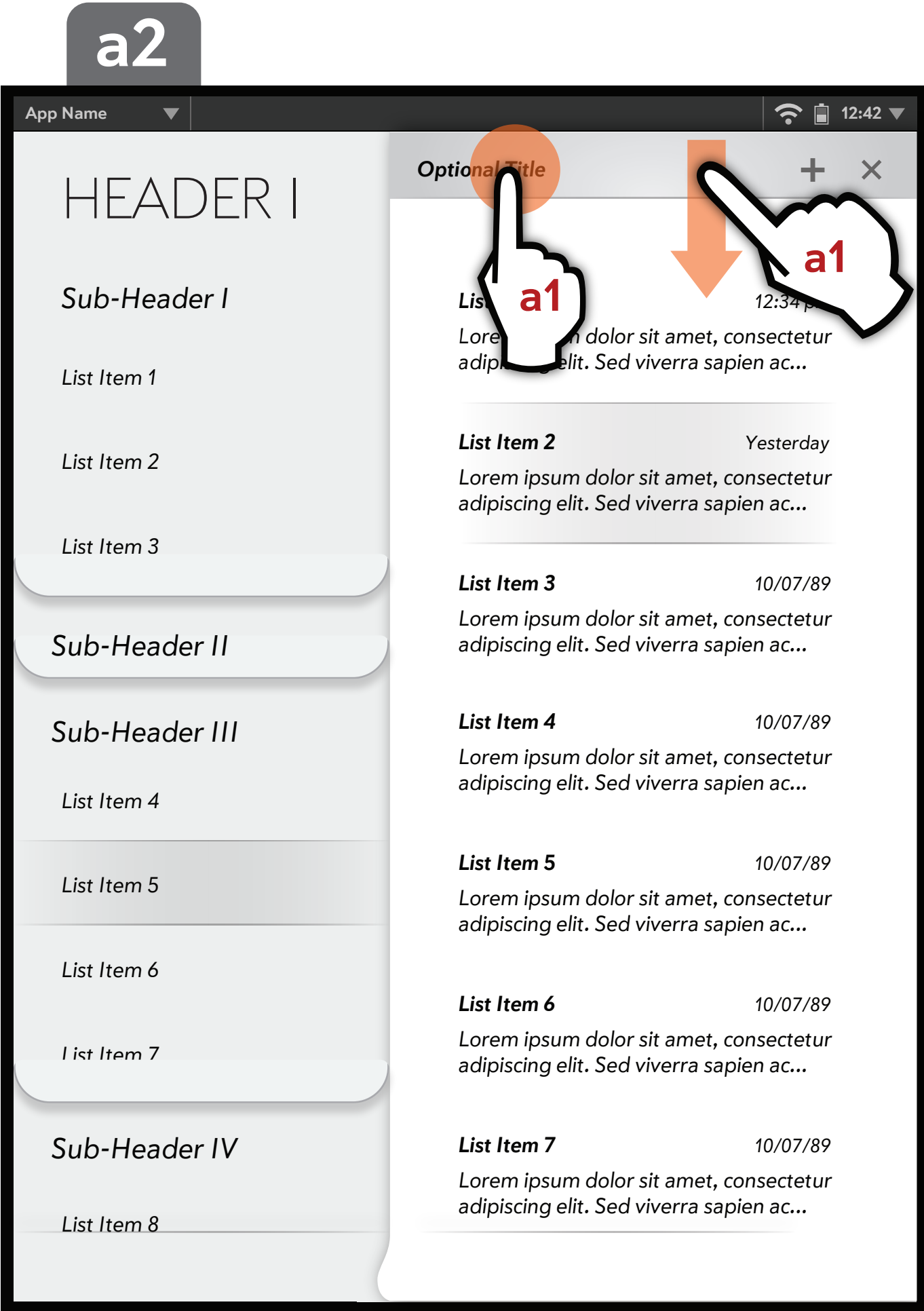
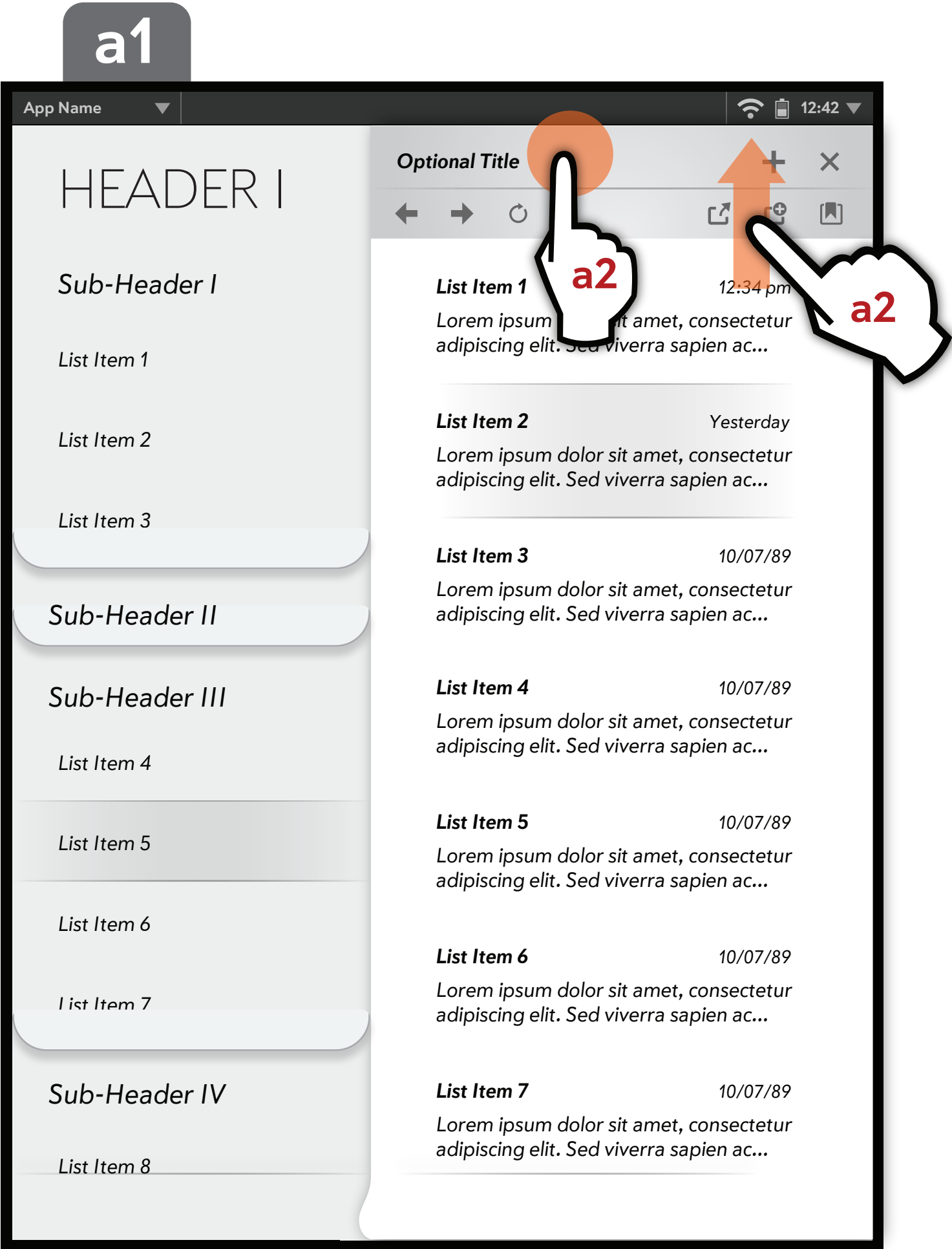


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HIDING OR SHOWING A TOOLBAR



a1. Swipe up from the chrome to dismiss the secondary toolbar. User can also tap on the primary chrome to toggle between hiding and showing the secondary chrome.

a2. Swipe down from the primary chrome to reveal the secondary toolbar, or tap to show.

Note that the toolbars sit on top of content, and content remains static. Content does not shift up if chrome is hidden.
